A SPECTACULAR SITE

The ‘Cœur de Vallée’ vineyard is situated in the world-renowned Oakville appellation, in the *heart* of the Napa Valley. The To Kalon Creek meanders through the spectacular property, which is planted to Cabernet Sauvignon and Cabernet Franc. The beautiful view of Mount Saint John is a reminder of the **alluvial fan** that provided the **well-draining soil**, comprised of **40 to 60% of gravel**. It is the confluence of the amazing pedigree of surrounding properties and the alluvial material originating from the Mayacamas Range that makes this vineyard so special. Handcrafted using classical winemaking techniques, this wine is named after its vineyard namesake. It is ‘Heart of the Valley’ or ‘Cœur de Vallée.’



THE 2021 VINTAGE

We experienced rains in January and February yet had almost no precipitation for the remainder of the 2021 season. This provided an environment for the vines to develop very small shoots and canopy. Bloom occurred in early spring with some shattering, which **naturally limited the future crop**. The drought conditions led to **petite berries and loose clusters**, with **excellent intensity, color, concentration and acidic structure**. The warm days of October, without heat spikes, brought an **even ripening of the tannins**, resulting in **tremendous softness while preserving freshness**. The élevage of the wines confirmed the strong personality of this **unquestionably great vintage**; a fantastic and age-worthy wine.

WINEMAKER NOTES

“The **stunning 2021 ‘Cœur de Vallée’** displays a dark vibrant purple hue with intense aromatics of cassis, dark chocolate, black olive and fruits confits intermixed with a complex bouquet of violets, wild sage, and notes of Foin de Crau and blond tobacco leaf. **Rich and concentrated**, yet **elegant and refined**, this outstanding wine possesses a **magnificent texture** with an **incredible sense of depth**.
