## ‘CŒUR DE VALLÉE’

### A SPECTACULAR SITE

The ‘Cœur de Vallée’ vineyard is situated in the world-renowned Oakville appellation, in the heart of the Napa Valley. A seasonal creek meanders through the spectacular property, which is planted to Cabernet Sauvignon and Cabernet Franc. The beautiful view of Mount Saint John is a reminder of the alluvial fan that provided the well-draining soil, comprised of 40 to 60% of gravel. It is the confluence of the amazing pedigree of surrounding properties and the alluvial material originating from the Mayacamas Range that makes this vineyard so special. Handcrafted using classical winemaking techniques, this wine is named after its vineyard namesake. It is ‘Heart of the Valley’ or ‘Cœur de Vallée.’

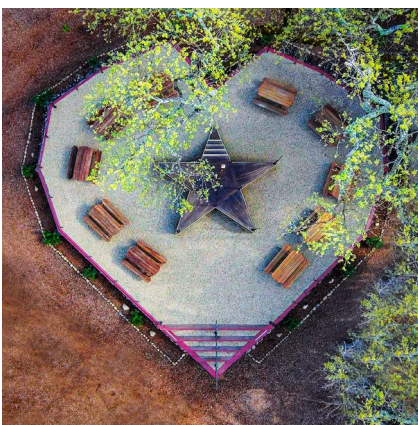


### THE 2023 VINTAGE

Early heavy winter rains ended a multiple-year drought (2020, 2021 & 2022 seasons), bringing much relief. The previous years’ conditions were still noticeable in the small size of the pruning wood. Yet, the abundant winter rainfall replenished the underground water and delayed budbreak by ten days. Subsequent mild and sunny weather boosted the vines, developing a full and healthy canopy through bloom, with only a small amount of shattering. This loss of berry set led to loose clusters, great air flow, and light sunbathing. Berries remained small, with a concentration of flavors and extra pigments. We carried out two thinning passes, further aerating the fruit zone and assuring the ultimate quality to the crop. Characterized by consistent, sunny, and mild weather, the ripening season provided a gentle and steady development of the flavors and phenolics, resulting in a full expression of the terroir. The end of harvest confirmed the excellence of this vintage.

### WINEMAKER NOTES

“Very dark in color, the 2023 ‘Cœur de Vallée’ boasts an extremely intense and complex bouquet of wild black fruit mélange, blueberry, and cassis intermixed with notes of crushed stone, foin de Crau, Quatre-Épices, and hints of iron. Full-bodied, the wine displays a seamless texture with beautiful density and a refined quality of tannins, finishing long with a bright and lingering lift. Graceful and lively, this Cabernet Sauvignon is a true vin de garde.” Luc Morlet, January 2026
